

Meeting June 9, 1975 start: 3:30pm in the afternoon

1. Horace Campbell: re his request for lower prices (ie movement prices) and a subsequent phone call asking about any decision about about this
 - a letter has been written to him explaining that our commercial book prices are a misnomer and that they are equivalent to Better Read's movement prices
 - therefore the prices we charged for the pamphlet are set and the prices for the book will be the same
 - is BR trying to make a profit out of this somehow??

2. Jesse's book: the main question was how many to print as Jesse ~~wx~~ wants to print 4000 and this may be out of our price range
 - what terms can be arranged with Reeve Bean - Sue will look into this
 - the general concensus was 3000 and perhaps a reprint if it is a world wide bestseler
 - report of distribution plans and progress which is optimistic (ie the book is moving along splendidly)
 - we may need more people to help in the week but they ~~w~~ will be expropriated when the time is nigh.
 - we will join COSMEP for the nominal fee of \$26 and get 6 books

3. Terrina's Camp: Jane needs some money to send her darling child to camp to keep her out of our collective necks for the weeks June 30-July 14
 - costs \$16 per week and it was passed enthusiastically and unanimously

4. Rosemary's Books: the reason ~~w~~ she was working here these 2 weeks is so that she can know the machines to run them non-commercially for Kids Can Press
 - her group publishes non-everything children's books (excluding interesting hopefully) generally a worthwhile project we all agree
 - we wanted to see some of her non-everything books but approval but granted in general

5. Prices: A survey was~~k~~ to be taken of our competitors to see how in line our prices were and how much we could raise them
 - Doug and Jane will do this and report meeting June 23
 - an increase of 15% was approved to be effective July 1/75 across the board and if the survey shows it is too much, we will decrease our prices again
